Time to Complete - 1 Hour

This fun design will work with your choice of rondelle beads and colors. Try a semi-precious rondelle, faceted Czech glass, or any other bead that is shaped approximately 3.5 x 6mm.

Can I use 11/0 instead of 10/0? You can substitute 11/0 by adding a fifth bead in Step 5.

Legend

S10 - Size 10/0 Seed Beads (or Size 11/0)

S8 - Size 8/0 Seed Beads

Duo - Superduo Two-Hole Bead

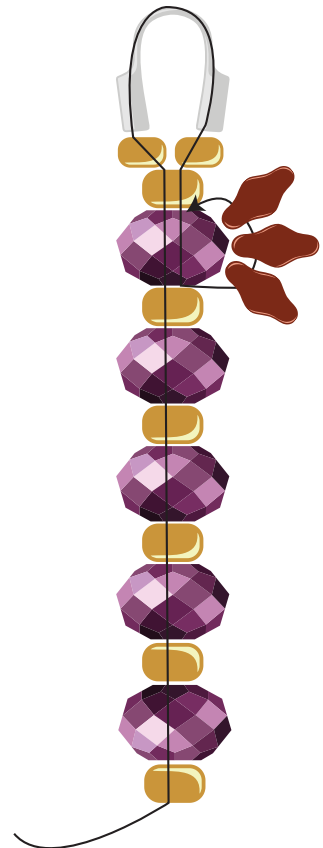
RB - Rondelle Bead 3.5 x 6mm (sometimes seen as Rondel)

Step 1

Cut 60" [152 cm] of beading thread. Thread one end with a size 10 beading needle and slide down 7" [18 cm] then fold over the thread.

Leaving a 15" [38 cm] tail, string [(1) S8 and (1) RB] 24 times (or to desired length). String (1) S8, (1) S10, go through a wire guardian, (1) S10, and then pass back through the S8 and the RB.

Pick up (3) Duo beads. Pass back through the RB.



Step 2

Exiting from the last RB, [go through the next S8 and RB. Pick up (3) Duo beads and pass back through the RB] 23 times (or to the last RB).

Step 3

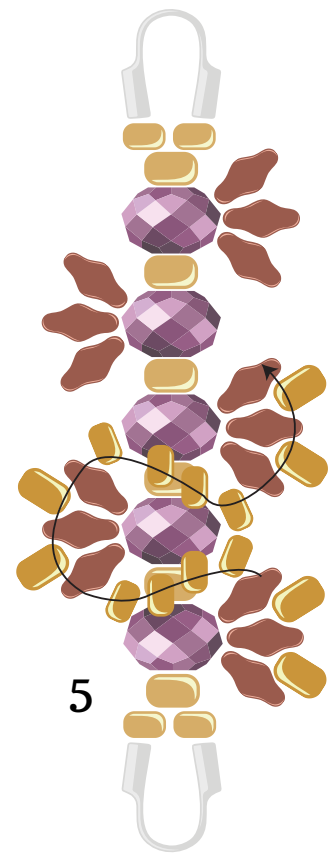
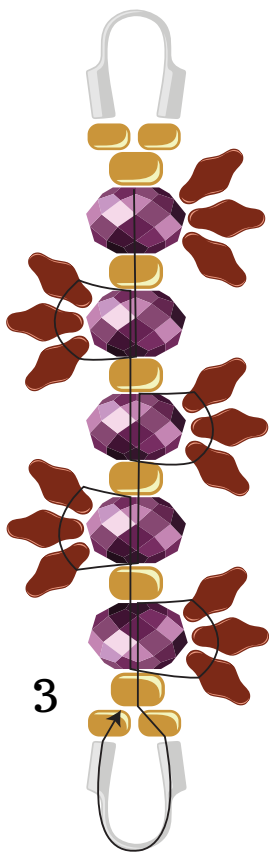
Go through the last S8. Pick up (1) S10 and go through a wire guardian. Pick up (1) S10.

Step 4

Continue through the S8 and RB. Turn and go through the bottom hole of the (3) Duo beads. Turn and go through the top hole of the last Duo. [Pick up (1) S8 and go through the top hole of the next Duo] 2 times.

Step 5

[Pick up (4) S10. Go through the top hole of the next Duo, located around the next RB. [Pick up (1) S8 and go through the top hole of the next Duo] 2 times. Repeat this step 23 times (or to the last Duo).



Weaving In and Reinforcing

Step 6

With your thread exiting the top hole of the last Duo bead, turn and pass through the bottom holes of the next (3) Duo. Turn and pass back through the RB and S8 above. Go through an S10, around the wire guardian, and through the other S10. Continue through the next S8, RB, S8, and RB.

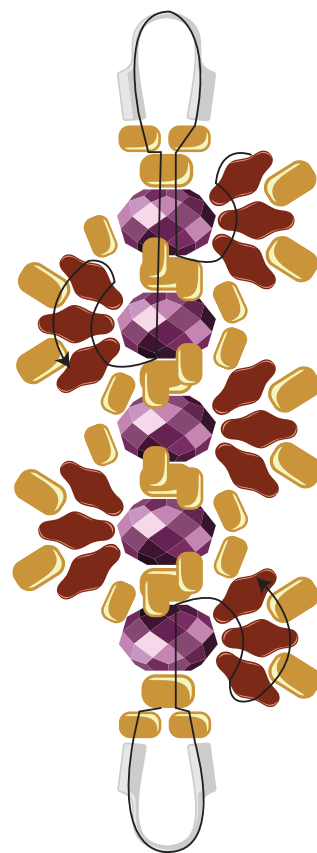
Weave in thread by going through the bottom holes of the next (3) duo. Turn and pass through the top hole of the Duo bead, continuing through the S8, Duo, S8, and Duo. [Continue through the next (4) S10 and the next set of Duo/S8 beads] 2 times. Trim remaining thread.

Step 7

Thread a needle onto the tail thread, which was left exiting from the first S8 bead. Weave around through the S10, wire guardian, the other S10 and back through the S8 and RB. Follow the thread path outlined in Step 6 above. Trim excess thread.

Step 8

Use any jump rings to attach the clasp of your choice and even charms to the wire guardians on either end of the bracelet.



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
