Intermediate. Some experience with even-count peyote stitch.

1 Hour Class

In this class we will explore the basic technique for a quick and sharp-looking bezel setting around a cabochon. Using even-count peyote stitch, we will surround the cabochon stone with John Bead Czech Glass Seed Beads using different size beads to taper a perfect fit around the stone. The design is finished with a simple peyote bail.

Legend and Abbreviations

20mm round Cabochon - Cab size 10/0 Czech seed bead - S10 size 8/0 Czech seed bead - S8 size 11/0 Delica - D11



Step 1

Create a lengthwise peyote band. Cut 70 inches of beading thread. Thread a size 12 beading needle onto each end. Bring two, S8 to the center, then bring both needles through an S8. Pull the strands apart to tighten the bottom beads into a side-by-side position. Pick up another S8 on each strand. Bring both needles through another S8. Repeat to desired length.

Tip:

Desired length may vary.
Test the band around the circumference of the widest part of the cabachon stone.




Step 2

Join the band into a circle around the stone. Go through the first beads added in step 1 with each strand. Make a turn and go back through the opposite beads to reinforce. Tighten this connection, then weave to exit top and bottom with each strand.




Step 3

Create the back of the bezel setting. Using D11, begin even count peyote stitch using one of the needles / strands. Step up when you reach the first D11 added in this round.




Continue even-count peyote stitch to add two more rows, remembering to step up after each round.



Tip: the back of the bezel may be worked without the stone in place.


Step 4

Using the other strand left in place at step 2, create the top of the bezel with S10. At this point, you will want to place the cabochon inside the setting. As you work these rows, use tight tension.



Step 5

Weave in one of the strands, whichever is shortest. Using the longer of the two, weave to exit a center S8, created in step 1. Pick up (1) S8 and go through the next S8, twice. (new S8 are shown in gold for clarity). Using even-count peyote stitch, create a total of 10 rows.



Step 6


Fold the tab of S8 created in step 5 over toward the back of the bezel. Join it to the corresponding S8, in the next row, from those we started.

This is an open, top view of the bail to show joining. The dot marks our starting point in Step 5.

Step 7 Cut a length of cotton cord. Run it through the bail. Tie one or two sliding knots at the top and trim ends.
