In this class we will explore a combination of techniques to create a shaped ring with John Bead Miyuki Delicas. Techniques explored in this class will include odd-count peyote, brick stitch, and reading patterns.

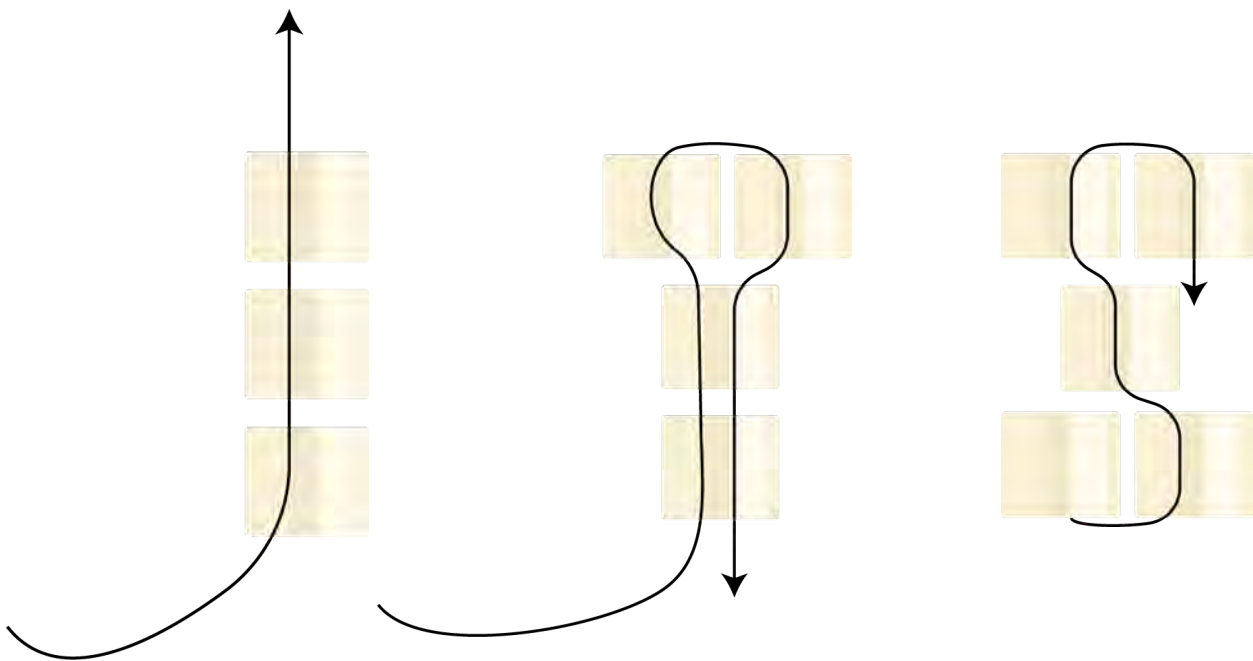
This pattern uses several colors of Miyuki Delicas. All are size 11/0. The pattern starts with a strip of three-column, odd-count peyote.

Step 1

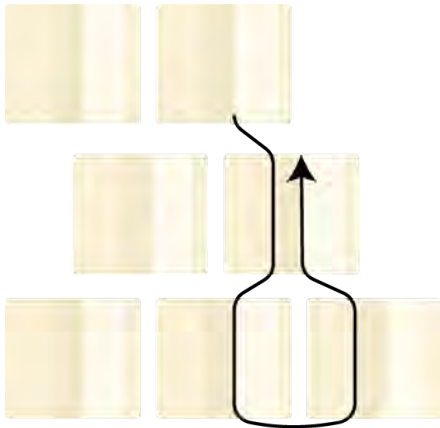
Cut 70 inches of beading thread. Thread a beading needle and fold over. Working with a single strand, leaving a 12" tail, string (3) Delicas in color 202, AB Pearl.

Pick up (1) Delica. Skipping the last Delica, go through the next (2).

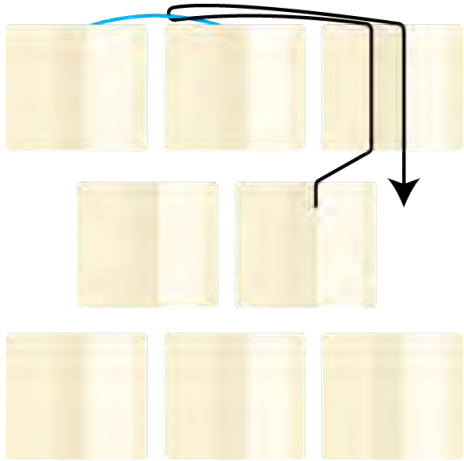
Pick up another Delica. Go back through the center Delica and then continue through the Delica above. Go through the one that is opposite your tail thread. Turn and come through the adjacent Delica.



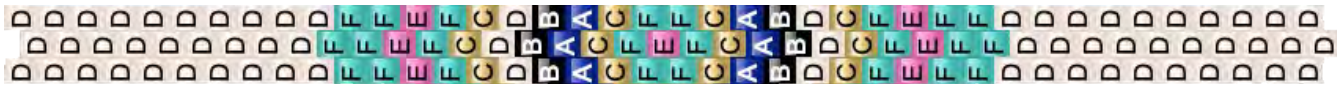
Pick up (1) Delica. Go through the next "up" Delica. Pick up (1) Delica. Turn, go back through the last Delica.



Complete an odd-count turn. Pick up (1) Delica, needle under the thread bridge on the side, then go back through that Delica.



Using this technique, and following the pattern below, complete the band.



Step 2

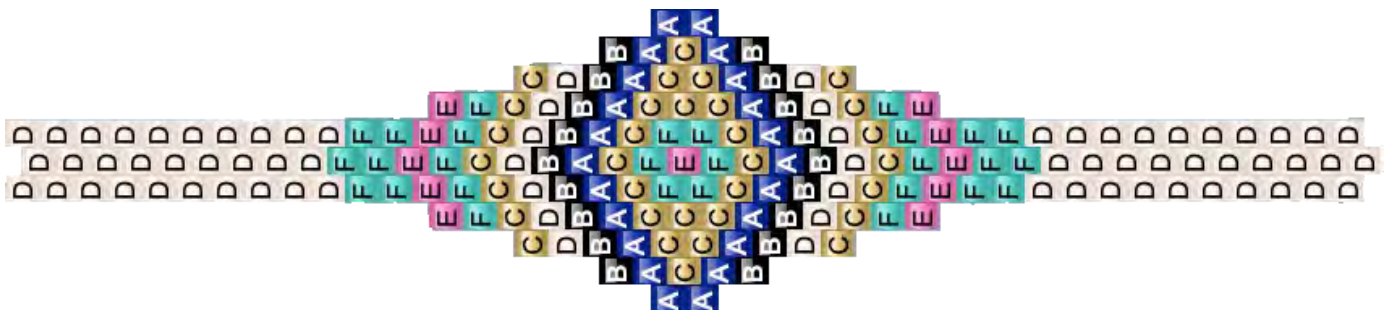
Weave to exit from the pink bead; it doesn't matter which side, top or bottom. Begin brick stitch to add the row above the peyote line.

For a review of brick stitch, refer to our past class, Brick Stitch Bees, dated July 8th, 2022.



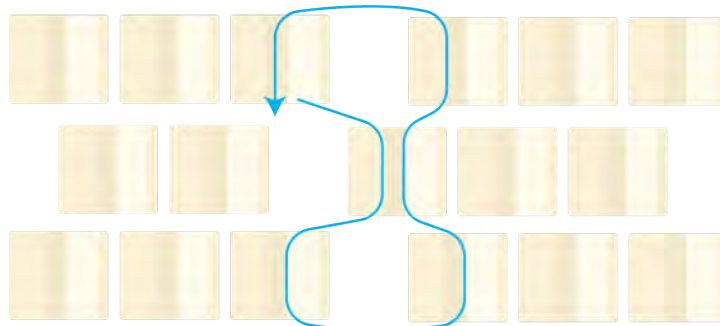
Weave to exit from the gold bead and brick stitch that row. To complete the final row, weave to exit from the blue beads and brick stitch two, blue Delicas.

Next, weave down to exit from one of the pink beads on the other side. Repeat the above to mirror the stitch on the other side.



Step 4

Using the tail thread left at Step 1, zipper stitch together the ends of the ring. The white pearl beads will fit together like a puzzle. Weave in the remaining thread and trim. Tip: add AB Pearl beads as necessary to increase length.
