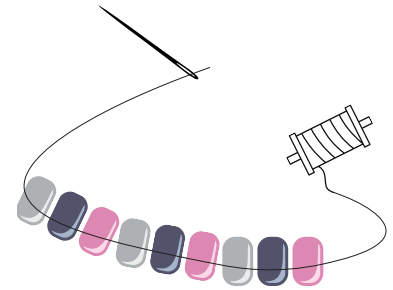

Intro

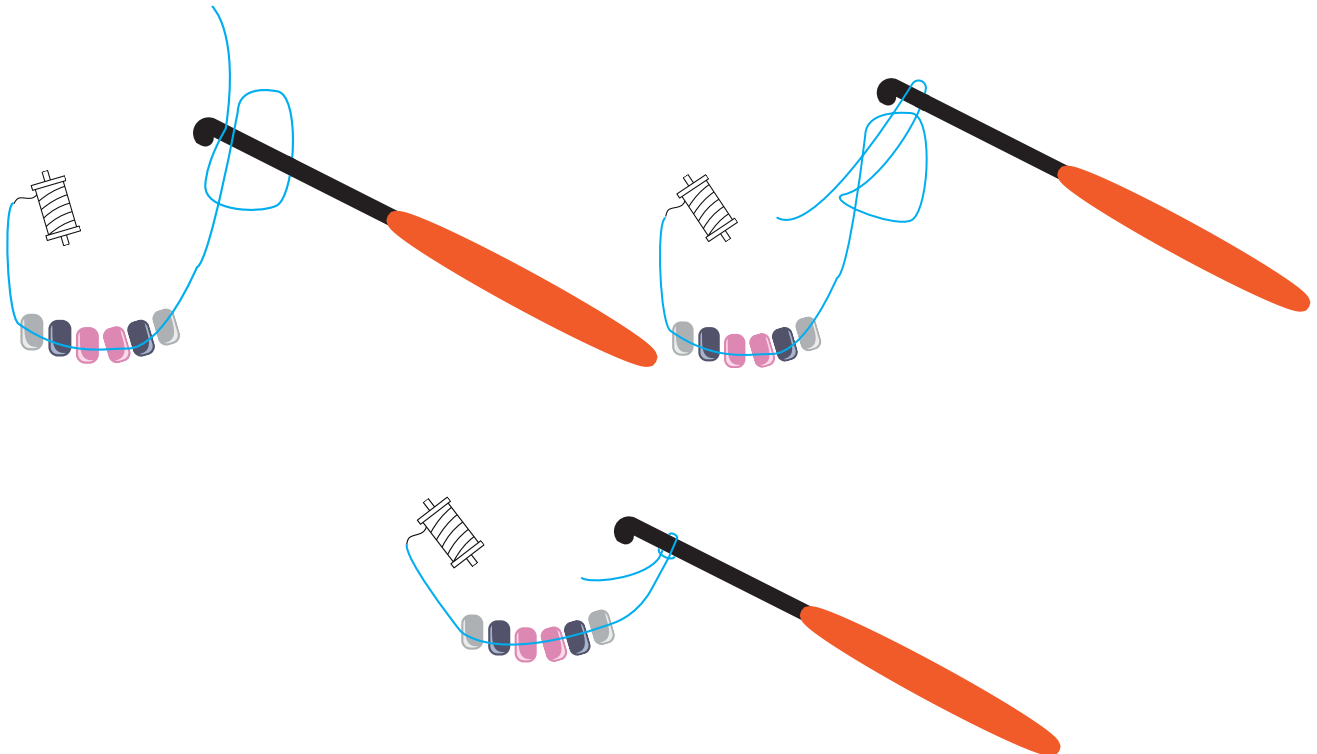
In this class we will explore basic crochet with beads to create a boho chic beaded pendant necklace with a convertible wear feature!

To begin, work directly from the spool by threading a collapsible eye needle onto the loose strand. String most or all of the beads from a 22 gram tube of John Bead Czech Seed Beads in size 6/0. Remove the collapsible eye needle.



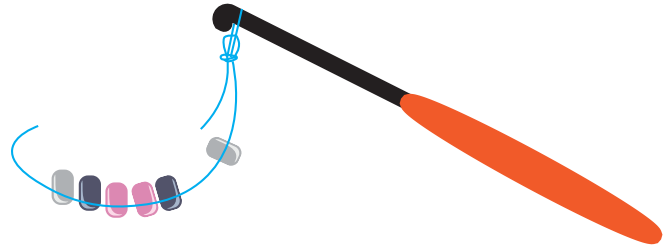
Step 1

Loop the end of the thread over your fingers twice, weaving the second wrap crossed over the first wrap. Insert the crochet hook into the loop and bring the second wrap out through the first wrap. Pull on the long strand to tighten. Try to leave a 7" to 10" tail at this step.

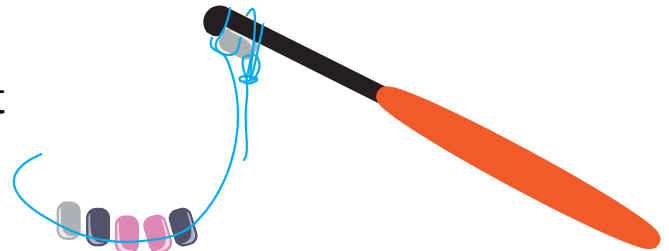


Step 2

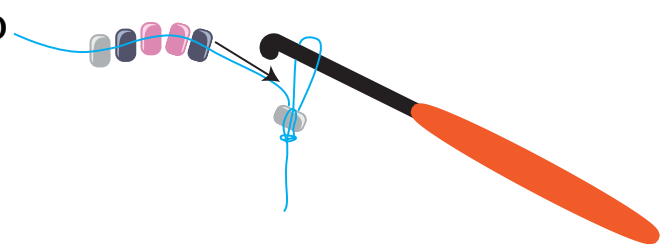
Chain one. To do this, yarn over the needle with the working thread and use the hook to pull it through the loop.



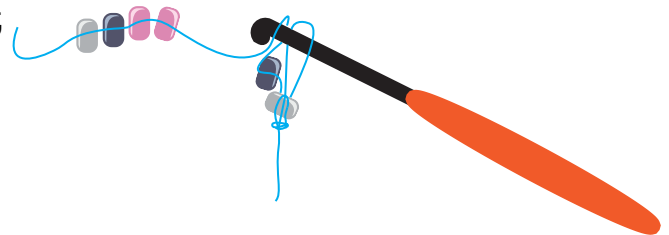
Chain one, but this time, bring up a bead to sit under the hook before you yarn over. Pull through the loop. The bead will sit in the V of the chain.



Repeat this step, continuing to bring down a bead before each yarn over. Continue this step to desired length.



Tips: Crochet is easy to pull out and start over. It is okay if you take a few tries to figure it out. Once it clicks, you will have it for life. It is kind of intuitive and automatic after a few successful attempts: don't give up!



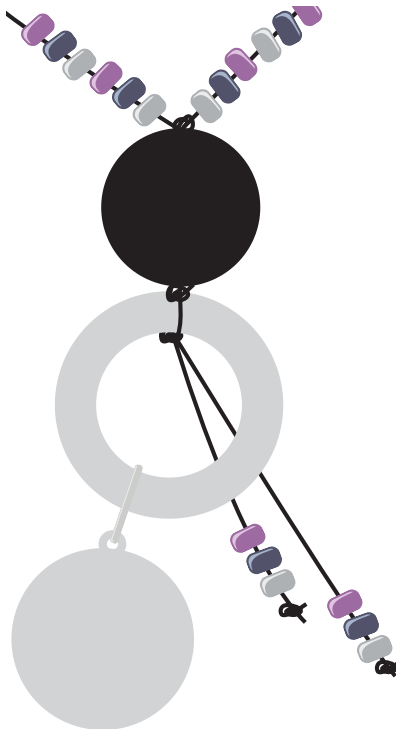
Step 3 Finishing

Trim the working thread from the spool, leaving a 10" tail. Yarn over once more, this time without a bead, and pull it through the loop on the hook. Continue to pull through the loop until the tail passes through it. Pull and a knot will form.

Bring the tail from the starting side and the ending side together. Thread the strands through a collapsible eye needle. Bring them through a 10mm pearl bead (or focal bead of choice).

Tie an overhand knot below the pearl bead, using your tweezers to help keep the knot tight against the bead.

Select a ring from the hook and eye clasp set. Bring one tail over the ring and the other under it. Overhand knot the strands securing the ring. String size 6/0 beads on the tails, knot, and trim each tail. Attach your charm to the ring using a jump ring.



Step 4

To make your necklace convert to double stranded, use the S-hook portion of the clasp. Bring the top of the necklace (the part that would sit behind your neck) down to meet the pendant. Hook each side of the S-hook to the place on each side where the necklace folds down. You can move and arrange the respective lengths easily by moving the hook.



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
