This class introduces a fun spin on classic daisy chain using John bead Czech Seed beads in pearl and vintage gold. Finished with a fun, beaded-button closure, you can embellish this bracelet with an alphabet charm as well as adapt the design to be anything you like!


S6 - White Pearl John Bead Czech Seed Beads

S11 - Vintage Gold John Bead Czech Seed Beads

### Step 1


Cut a 70 inches of beading thread and thread a size #12 beading needle. Place a stopper bead by going twice through a size 11/0 seed bead, leaving a 15" tail.

\*String (3) S11 beads, (1) S6 bead, and (1) S11 bead. Go back through the S6. Go through the next S11, in the opposite direction to the exiting thread.




### Step 2

Go back through the S6 and the S11 on the other side. [Pick up (4) S11. Circle around the S6 and go through the S11 on the other side] twice.



### Step 3

With your thread exiting from the last S11, repeat from \* in Step 1 through Step 2 to desired length.




To add larger pearl beads, follow these same steps, but vary the counts when circling around the larger bead, as described in the [brackets] in step 2. Here are the counts for the two other bead sizes used in the example:

6mm Pearl Bead = (8) S11

8mm Pearl Bead = (10) S11


### Step 4

Here is a fun way to clasp your design. Starting with the beaded-button side. Pick up (2 or 3) S11 and (2) S6. [Pick up (7) S11. Go back through the (2) S6] 8 times. Pick up (1) S6 and (1) S11. Go back through the S6. Continue through the (2) S6 inside the button and continue through the next S11 leading into the button. From there, weave into the next daisy. Continue weaving in, or optionally, tie a half-hitch knot. Trim.



## Step 5

Create the button loop on the other side. Remove the stopper bead from the beginning. Using the 15" tail, string (10) S11 (you'll already have (2) S11 on the strand after removing the stop bead), (1) S6, (1) S11 and go back through the S6. String (10) S11. Go through the S11 your thread is exiting, heading in the opposite direction. Reinforce this loop once or twice more. Weave in thread and trim.



## Step 6

Open the jumo ring on a charm. Attach to any place along the daisy chain that you like.



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
