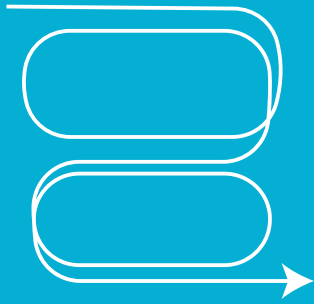

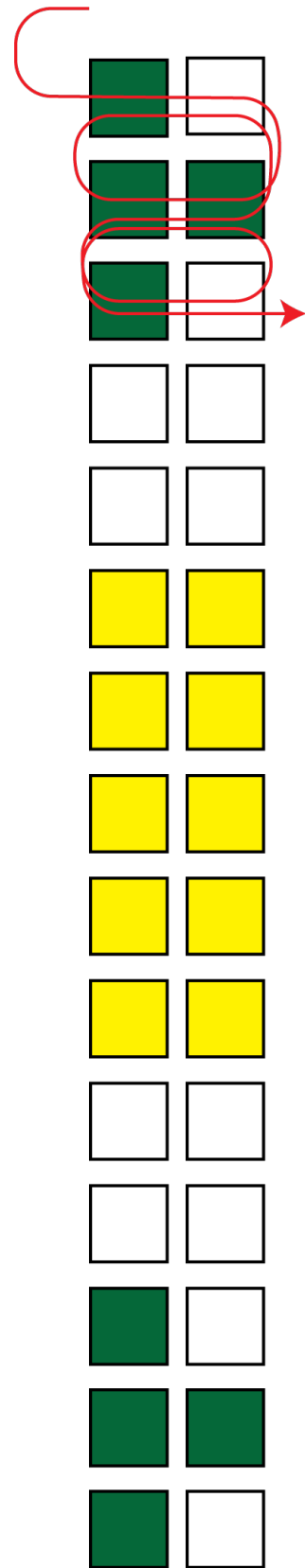
Ladder Stitch and 2 Drop Brick Stitch Refresher

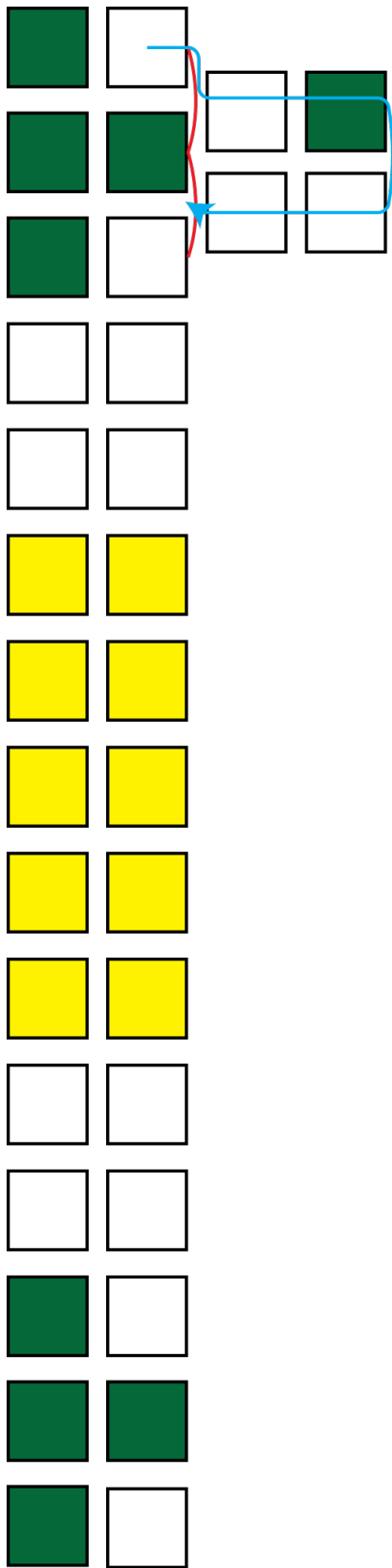
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STEP 1

To start, cut a length of nylon beading thread that is approximately 120 inches in length. String a size #10 beading needle. Leaving a 70 inch tail, complete Row 1 of the Top Part of the pattern using 2-drop ladder stitch technique.





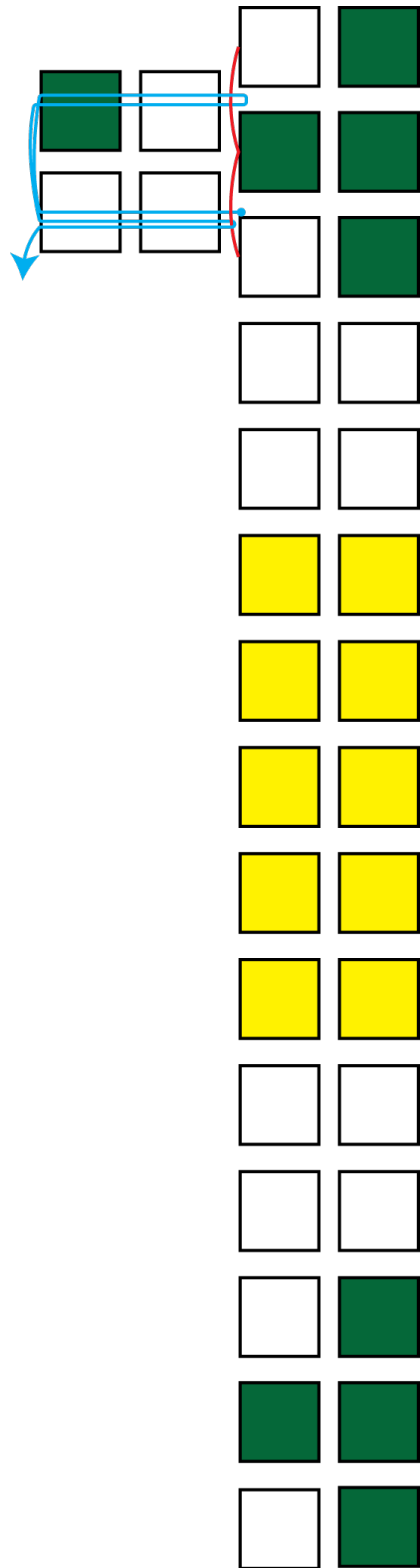
STEP 2

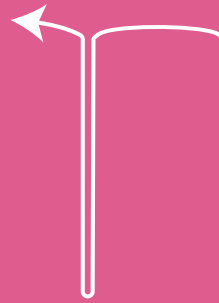
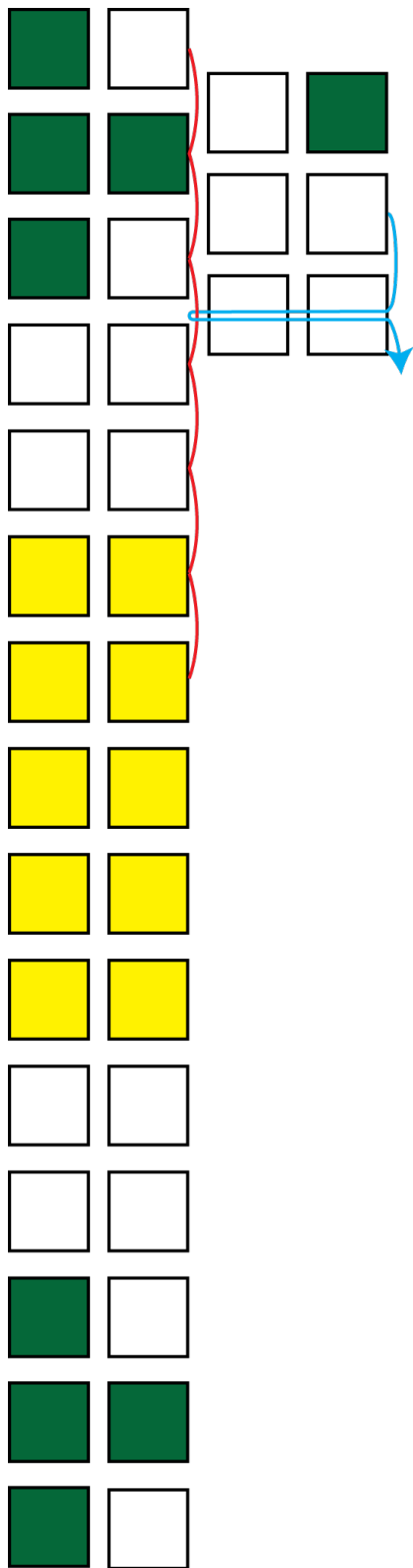
Start the next row by selecting the first four colors in the pattern for Row 2. Needle under the second thread bridge and come back through the last two beads added.



STEP 3

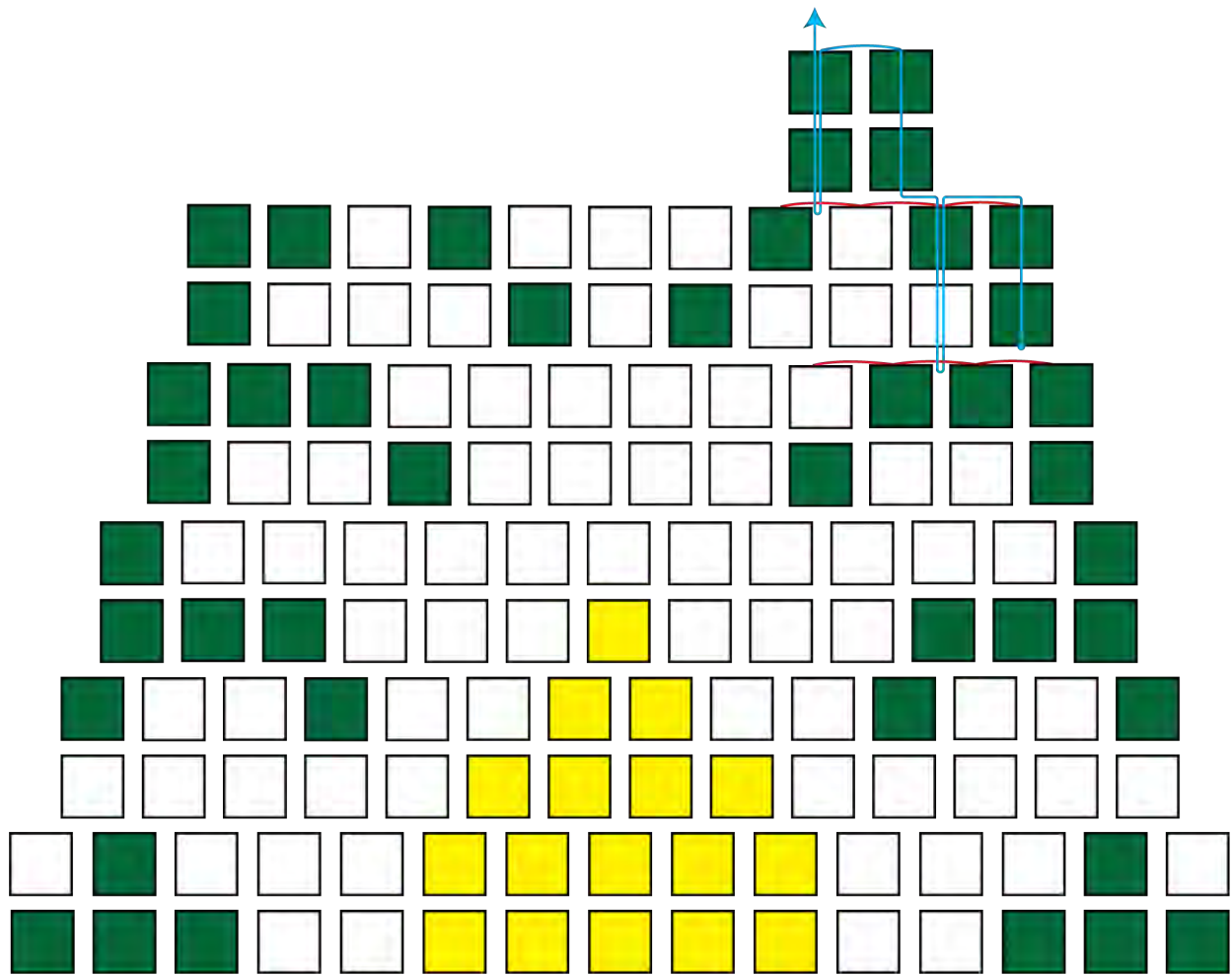
If needed, a great tip to help these first two columns sit side by side, go back through the first two beads, under the first thread bridge above Row 1, then come up through the next stack. When you pull to tighten this, the two stacks should snuggle up and align.



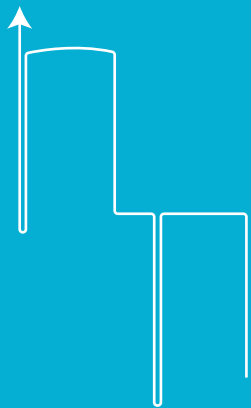


STEP 4

Select the next stack of two beads in the row. Needle under the third thread bridge and come back up through those beads. Repeat to the end of the row.



STEP 5



Complete the Rows 3, 4, and 5 in the Top Part of the pattern, per the above. When ready to start Row 6, you'll notice that an indent, or decrease, is required. To do this, needle down through the stack of two beads next to the one your thread will be exiting upon having finished Row 5.



Needle under the second thread bridge above Row 5 and come back up through the same beads. From here, select the four beads needed to start Row 6 and proceed as described for the previous rows.

The remaining Top Part, Rows 7 and 8, use the same decrease technique.

The final step is to create a loop of six beads exiting from the two columns of Row 8. Reinforce this, then weave in and trim this thread.

Move your needle to the tail thread. Use the Fringe Chart in Marta's pattern to create each strand of fringe. Counts have been provided, which is super handy!

When the last strand of fringe is complete, weave remaining thread into the Top Part and trim.

Attach an ear wire to the loop of six beads at the top.

MATERIALS

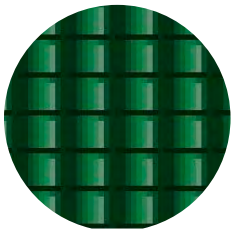
Seed beads (5 Colors)
Nylon thread

TECHNIQUE

2 drop brick stitch bead
stringing

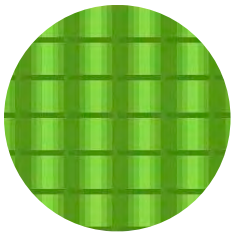
SIZE

(not including the loop)



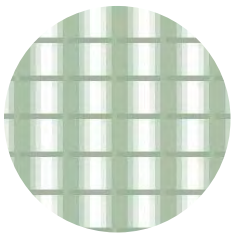

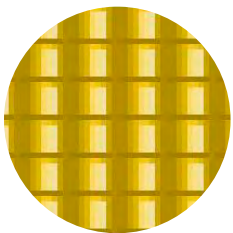

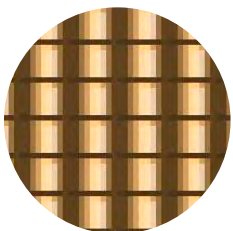
