Introduction
Join us for a fun class embellishing little critters with tiny crystals! We will demo creating simple brick stitch animals and gluing flatback crystals to make them extra sparkly.

Two Bonus Patterns are Included! Red Fox and Little Gator cuties~


## Step 1

Identify the widest row in the pattern. Owl has two, so we chose the one closest to the middle so we can work with our thread from a midpoint.

Lay out beads on the mat in order according to the bead legend.


Cut a wingspan of beading thread and thread a size 11 beading needle. Leaving a long tail, 27 -inches, work single column peyote stitch to create the widest row and the row above it, as shown.


Step 2
Begin decreasing brick stitch to create the row above according to the pattern. In a normal decrease row, each thread bridge hosts one bead.


Step 3
To create an increase at the beginning of a row, place two beads into the first thread bridge.


Step 4
To create an increase at the end of a row, you'll need to add an additional bead to the last thread bridge.

## Step 5

Add a wire guardian at the top. Identify the center and weave to exit from the bead to the right of it. String on the wire guardian and reinforce. You'll need to use the thread path shown under the guardian stems to turn. After reinforcing, weave in and trim remaining thread.


Step 6
Work the tail thread left at Step 1 to complete the bottom half of the pattern. When you reach the last full row at the bottom, you'll encounter an indent. You'll need to weave to exit from the bead nearest the thread bridge your first bead starts above. Add that first bead to the thread bridge identified in the pattern to start the indented row.


When you have to skip thread bridges, weave through to reach the bead nearest the thread bridge you need. An increase is shown at the end of this row.


## Step 7

Make a second owl. Lay the owl on a flat surface and using the glue pen, apply tiny dots of glue above the beads where you'd like crystals. Use the wax picker to place the tiny crystals. Allow to dry. The glue will dry clear.


## Step 8

Turn your owls into earrings! Place a gemstone onto an eye pin and form a simple loop. Use 4 mm Jump ring to attach the owl by the wire guard. Attach an ear wire to the top of the eye pin. Photo on cover.
