

Good Thread #10720723
Scissors #10354409
Pliers #10334538

## Tips:


- Be aware that crystals can be sharp, so take care when pulling the thread through.
- Tension is key for this project. A firm tension should be used throughout.



On a wingspan of thread, pick up 2(A), 4(B), 1(C), 4(B). Leave a 15cm tail, before taking your needle back up the 2(B). Push the 4(B), 1(C), 4(B) to the left.


2 Pick up 4(B), 1(C), 4(B) and go back up the 2(A) again. Push the new beads to the right.







3 Pick up 1(A), 4(B), 1(C), 4(B). Take your needle up the 2nd (A) from the previous round and the new (A). Push these new beads to the left.

Pick up 4(B), 1(C), 4(B) and go up the 2(A) again as in step 3. Push these new beads to the right.







5 Repeat steps 3 & 4 until your bracelet is long enough. Leave space for the clasp. Coming out of the last (A), pick up 6(B).




Take your needle down the first (B) you just picked up in step 5 to create a loop of the 5(B). Go through the next 2(A) and around the left hand side 4(B), 1(C), 4(B).

7 Take your needle through the first (B) of the 5(B) loop and then through the next 4(B).





8. Take your needle through the 4(B), 1(C), 4(B) on the right hand side of your bracelet. Go back up the 2(A), 1(B).



9. Reinforce the loop on this end and then go down the full length of (A) beads to reach the other end of your bracelet. Repeat steps 5-8 on this end. Once finished, weave in any remaining threads.



10 Using pliers, attach a jump ring and half a clasp to each loop.

Your bracelet is now finished.
