



RAINBOW SHAVE ICE

A Step-by-Step Beading Tutorial

Project

- Make a Rainbow Shave Ice Charm! Shave, not shaved. Enjoy ultra-fluffy, colorful, and snowy flakes with Hawaii-only flavors. You need a no-escape bowl and a straw because every last drop of that sweet syrup deserves to be slurped.
- Made with Cylin Beads by John Bead.
- Technique: Brick Stitch Beading
- Measurement: 2.3 cm x 2.3 cm


Supplies

- 40 inches Beading Thread
(6lb Fireline, Crystal, used in this sample)
- Size 12 Beading Needle
- Small soldered closed jump ring for “straw”.
(2.5mm used in this sample)
- Size 11/0 John Bead Cylin Beads
- Pink #1101
- Turquoise Green #1048
- Dark Turquoise Blue #1049
- Yellow #1053
- Fire Cracker Red #1059
- Royal Blue #1082

BRICK STITCH BASICS


1. Decreasing Stitch: Narrows the row.

- Red Line: Start by picking up two beads (1, 2) and pass your needle under the second thread bridge. Then, go up through the second bead (2).
- Blue Line: Loop back through the two beads - down the first bead (1) and up the second bead (2). This helps to keep the beads aligned.
- Green Line: Add one bead (3), go under the next thread bridge, and come back up through the same bead.
- Keep adding one bead at a time until your row is complete.




2. Increasing Stitch: Widens the row.

- Begin by picking up two beads (1, 2) and pass your needle under the first thread bridge. Then, go back up through the second bead (2).
- Next, add one bead (3). Pass your needle under the next thread bridge, then return through the same bead.
- Keep adding beads one at a time.




3. Increasing at the End of a Row:

- Option 1: Share the previous thread bridge.
 - Pick up the last bead (4) and anchor it to the previous thread bridge.
 - Go back up the last bead (4).
 - If your bead is wobbly, you can secure it by circling back down bead 3 and up bead 4.




- Option 2: Share the bridge with the bead below.
 - Pick up the last bead (4).
 - Pass your needle through the bead directly below.
 - Anchor to the thread bridge.
 - Go back up the two beads.



SHAVE ICE DIAGRAM

Bead Legend and Bead Graph


TG: TURQUOISE GREEN	TB: TURQUOISE BLUE	Y: YELLOW	R: RED	RB: ROYAL BLUE	P: PINK
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Tip: Gently pinch your beadwork while stitching. For each new row, consider flipping the beadwork so you always stitch in the same direction. These steps can help you maintain consistent tension.



SHAVE ICE INSTRUCTIONS

1. Stop Bead: Slide the bead halfway down your thread.



2. Rows 1 & 2: Foundation



- Pick up three TB beads (1, 2, 3) and go back down through the first bead (1).
- Add one TB bead (4) and pass through the bead that is protruding above (3).
- Add another TB bead (5) and go through the protruding bead below (4).
- Add one bead at a time until you complete the two rows. 22TB beads: 6 -27.




3. Row 3: Decreasing Stitch

- Get into position to stitch Row 3 by going up through the adjacent beads on Rows 1 & 2 (24, 25).
- Pick up two TB beads (28, 29).
- Pass your needle under the second thread bridge (between beads 23 and 25).
- Go back up the second bead (29).
- Pick up one P bead (30), pass your needle under the next thread bridge (between 21 & 23), and go back up the same P bead (30).
- Continue adding beads one at a time (31 - 40).

P, 5Y, 2R, 2TB





4. Row 4: Multiple Bead Decrease


- Move into position to stitch Row 4 by passing through beads 39 and 38.
- Pick up two R beads (41, 42).
- To stack the beads in the desired spot, pass the needle under the third thread bridge (between 38, 37), then go back up the second bead (42).
- Pick up one R bead (43), pass your needle under the next thread bridge (between 37, 36), and go back up the same bead (43).
- Continue to add one bead at a time. Beads 44 - 47: 4Y, 3P.

Weaving through the beads was the easiest way to get into position to stitch the new decreasing row.



5. Row 5: Decreasing Stitch


- Pick up two P beads (51, 52).
- Pass under the second thread bridge (between 48, 49), then go back up the second P bead (52).
- Loop back through the two beads - down the first P bead (51) and up the second P bead (52).
- Continue adding one bead at a time. Beads 53 - 59: 5Y, 2R.



SHAVE ICE INSTRUCTIONS

6. Row 6: Increasing Stitch

- Pick up two R beads (60, 61).
- Pass under the first thread bridge (between 59, 58), then go back up the second R bead (61).
- Add one bead at a time. Beads 62 - 68: R, 4Y, 2P
- Pick up the last P bead (69). Pass down through the P bead below (51), pass under the thread bridge on Row 4 (between 49, 50), then back up 51 and 69.




6. Rows 7 -9: Decreasing Stitch. Follow the diagram or word chart below. Always start your row with **2 beads**, then add additional beads individually.

7: 2P, P, 3Y, B, 2R


8: R, B, 4Y, 2P

9: 2P, 3Y, R, B



7. Straw and Jump Ring


- Pick up two B beads (94, 95) and the jump ring.
- Go back down the four B beads (95, 94, 93, 80).





8. Reinforce Straw and Jump Ring

- Go back up the R bead (79), three B beads (93, 94, 95), and through the jump ring.
- Go back down three B beads (95, 94, 93), and up the adjacent R bead (92).



9. Row 10. Decreasing Stitch. **R, Y, Y, P**




The diagram has been flipped.

Remove the stopper bead and switch the needle to the thread tail.


10. Row 11. Decreasing Stitch.

- Move into position to stitch Row 11 by going down the adjacent bead (4), then up the next bead (6).
- Pick up two TB beads (100,101).
- To stack the beads in the desired spot, pass the needle under the third thread bridge (between 6, 8), then go back up the second bead (101).
- Continue adding one bead at a time. Beads 102 - 109. TG. 2TB, TG, 2TB, TG, TB



SHAVE ICE INSTRUCTIONS

11. Row 12 - 15. Decreasing Stitch. Follow the diagram or word chart below. Always start your row with 2 beads, then add beads individually.



When you are done securing the final bead (139), weave the excess thread into your beadwork in a zig-zag path. Also, weave in the excess thread from the top of the beadwork. Cut the extra thread and enjoy your Shave Ice!
